Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(ii), plaintiff El Comite de Apoyo a los Trabajadores Agricolas (CATA) and defendant City of Bridgeton hereby stipulate to the dismissal of the complaint in this matter, on the following terms:

1. The City of Bridgeton agrees that it will not seek to collect any fees from CATA for CATA's May 1, 2007, march.


2. The City of Bridgeton agrees that, under currently existing ordinances, policies and practices, it will not seek to impose any fees for future marches or other expressive activity protected by the first amendment in the city's public forums.

3. The City of Bridgeton retains the right to adopt ordinances regulating such activity, including, to the extent legally permissible, imposition of fees therefor.

4. CATA retains the right to challenge such ordinances in the future, should it believe them to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
