# CODE BLUE: When any of the following conditions are forecast to exist *for at least 12 hours in any 24-hour period*

- Wind Chill < 20° F
- Temp < 32° F w/ snow and/or freezing rain
- Temp  $< 25^{\circ}$  F w/ winds > 15 mph
- Other severe weather conditions as may occur posing urgent threats to the health of the unsheltered population which are of an acute nature and require immediate response


Houses of Worship (Incorporated Church) "Hospitality Room"\*\*


- May shelter for no more than 14 consecutive days
- May not exceed 49 days of sheltering in a year
- May house 14 or fewer persons at a time (Can not house more than fire/building/health code allows)
- Inspections /No code violations
- Must maintain minimum health and safety standards
- American Red Cross Shelter Training
- Insurance


#### Hotel/Motel

If you do not fall under the parameters of the above regulations then you must have a DCA license to shelter in order to shelter using Code Blue Funding.



### **GOALS**

- This "Code Blue" Plan and declaration is designed to attempt to prevent hypothermia, frostbite and other cold weather related injuries that could lead to death for the unsheltered population within the County of Burlington.
- Establish climatic thresholds for Code Blue situations.
- To provide direction, care and assistance that is needed in the event of a declaration of a "Code Blue" emergency.
- To help coordinate agencies and staff members at various County locations through implementation of a unified plan.
- To inform various emergency responders to when a Code Blue is declared.
- To readily identify the employees, agencies, clients, facilities and families who are affected in the case of a "Code Blue" declaration.
- To raise public awareness of the plight of unsheltered families and individuals.
- To enhance volunteerism and to increase and establish directed donations for sheltering activities.

## Definition

A "Code Blue" alert will be announced by the Burlington County Health Officer upon determination of a health emergency as defined below:

- Wind chill less than 20 degrees Farenheight
- Temperatures less than 25 degrees Farenheight with winds of 15 miles per hour or higher
- Temperatures less than 32 degrees Farenheight with snow and/or freezing rain
- Other severe weather conditions as may occur posing urgent threats to the health
  of the unsheltered population, which are of an acute nature and require
  immediate response.
- When any of the above conditions are anticipated to exist for at least twelve hours in any twenty-four hour period.
- Multiple Code Blue days may be declared if the weather forecast indicates the above conditions will occur and be sustained



#### **Declaration Process**

- 1. The Burlington County Health Coordinator shall, in concurrence with the Emergency Management, declare a "Code Blue" condition for the County or effected area of the County.
- 2. The Burlington County Health Coordinator will review on a daily basis emerging conditions for "Code Blue" from Federal, State or other privately recognized weather recording authorities.
- 3. Where possible, advanced weather forecasting information shall be utilized to assist with adequate notice for evening, weekend and holiday interventions. Where required, weekend notifications will be issued via Telephonic notification and/or email notification with follow-up telephonic calls to designated officials.
- 4. Upon determination of an emerging "Code Blue" condition, the Burlington County Health Coordinator will advise the Emergency Management Coordinator.
- 5. Upon agreement and concurrence, the County Health Officer shall then advise the County Human Services Administrator, designated staff of the County Human Services Administrator, the Public Information Office, the Health Educator, and other officials as needed from time to time..
- 6. The Human Services Administrator will notify CONTACT of Burlington County at 2-1-1 and other service providers and officials participating within the program.
- 7. In the event of an absence of key personnel, authorized representatives, as may be designated from time to time, shall perform the functions as designated within the plan.
- 8. The Burlington County Health Department's Risk Communicator/Health Educator shall, in advance of a "Code Blue" declaration, pre-prepare DRAFT press releases for dissemination through the County Public Information Office for the purposes of informing the media and public at large of a "Code Blue" declaration. This is intended to inform the public of the situation and to be on the lookout for and to report unsheltered individuals.



### Summary

These Code Blue Guidelines address the health and safety of persons subjected to severe cold weather. They put into place a mechanism for short-term emergency sheltering that uses existing certain 24 hr response services.

Code Blue in Burlington County is specifically designed to eliminate barriers that might interfere with someone accessing sheltering services. For this, it utilizes the strong, healthy partnerships that exist amongst and between public and private agencies concerned with protection of vulnerable citizens of Burlington County.

At this point, the scope of these Guidelines is limited as regards requirements for organizations to respond to a Code Blue situation in Burlington County. It does not mandate the participation of or action to be given by any entity other than those specifically identified on page 6 of these Guidelines or those otherwise contractually obligated to so do.

The overall matter of Code Blue is assigned as an ongoing concern to the Burlington County Comprehensive Emergency Assistance System (CEAS) Committee of the Human Service Advisory Council. The CEAS Committee is charged with the review and update of these guidelines as needed.
